PALETTE

Hero colors inspired by the shades & tones of the Adriatic coast: ivy greens, sky blues, sun-bleached yellows, granite greys, and deep reds.

PATTERNS & ARTWORK

Oil painting style prints, sans serif & italic brand text, hand drawn style flower motifs, an expressive collab with artist Gianluca Cannizzo, checkerboard patterns, pinstripes, allover flag embroidery, tablecloth & wallpaper patterns.

STANDOUT PIECES

Short Sleeve Shirts: Tablecloth print TENCEL™, allover jacquard, embroidery anglaise, & wallpaper ramie/cotton blends.

Long Sleeves & Overshirts: TENCEL™ & linen essentials, allover embroidered pieces, flower motif denim, & oil-painting jacquard.

Pants & Shorts: Relaxed fit denim, linen suit and drawstring pants, cotton slim fit suit pants, linen & denim shorts.

Knitwear: Knitted cotton short sleeve shirts, linen blend polos, slub yarn cotton roundnecks & polos.

Jersey & Track: Textured track jackets, shorts, and pants in boxy fits, jersey, mesh & knitted tank tops.

Outerwear: Box-fit blazers, denim & suede jackets, technical varsity jackets, workwear jackets, cotton coats.

Shoes: Leather pool slides, chunky sole boat shoes, suede loafers, derbies, & desert boots, '90s style sneakers.

Accessories: Paisley, wallpaper, and oil-painting style ties, leather belts handmade in Denmark, bold-print neckerchiefs, a new series of technical nylon/canvas bags.

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The New Yorker effortlessly unites contrasting styles.

Comfortable in '90s-inspired streetwear and preppy pieces, he draws on the bro-core trend by adding sportswear in technical nylon into his attire.

He'll often partner a pair of chunky moc toes with denim and a varsity jacket.

For the New Yorker though, adding something different to round off his style is essential. He has a passion for old Americana artwork and workwear, and his wardrobe is heavily stacked with varsity jackets and collegiate inspired artwork on iersey and tees.


He also adds more formal lvy League elements to his rotation, partnering casua pieces with a heritage pattern blazer.

Ultimately, The New Yorker is comfortable in his skin and confident in his style, incorporating new trends into his wardrobe while remaining true to his own distinctive look.



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




















































The Neapolitan is passionate about the clothing he wears, encapsulating the Italian appreciation of sophistication and personal expression through fashion.

He's deeply knowledgeable about tailoring, and has a love of blazers, airy short sleeve shirts, and casual slub yarn knit polos.

His selection of loafers and moc toes are handmade in Portugal from the finest leather and suede.

He also knows that while the rules of fashion are important, just sometimes they're there to be broken.

Drawing on sportswear influences, he incorporates nostalgic nylon pieces into his style, whether that's a tactile nylon track jacket or bold tapestry print technical shorts.

Suave and distinguished, the Neapolitan's choice of light and airy materials in formal and sporty cuts is a product of the Mediterranean climate he's accustomed to.



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For the Croatian, functionality is just as important as style.

He believes it's necessary that his style of clothing tells a story about him, his history, and his roots as the descendant of a long line of fishermen. However, breathability and comfort are non-negotiable.

Light knitted short sleeve shirts, traditionally inspired flower motifs in a hand-stitched style, and easy wearing pieces with artwork depicting the landscape around him are what mark out the Croatian's style.

It's a rustic, authentic, and unpretentious way of dressing that reflects an upbringing that put family first. He wears a cap not just for the way it looks, but for shading his eyes against the hot Adriatic sun.

His way of dressing is inspired by what he sees around him every day, like a shirt decorated with a tablecloth pattern similar to one found in his neighborhood tavern.

The Croatian knows what he likes: down-to-earth style that looks good and serves a purpose.





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
















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
